Hall Opening Progress Evening 'HOPE'

On Monday 12th September the Brampton Abbotts Village Hall Trustees welcomed more than 40 local residents to an event showcasing the renovation progress of the Village Hall. The Trustees outlined how they intend to communicate ongoing progress, the fundraising needs and what works are required to get the hall open again. Refreshments were kindly donated by Hanks, Morrisons and The Tap House for the event.









On the night £3,100 was raised from the launch of a 'Buy a Brick' Campaign. Individuals can support the project by purchasing a plaque inscribed with their name, to be displayed on the Village Hall wall. A further £7,750 was raised from an annual Corporate Sponsorship initiative, taken up by EOB Distribution Ltd, Oak House Nursery School and The Evans Family, Overton.

Gents Toilets


