## Chairman's Update January 2025

With 2024 seemingly long gone we are already accelerating through January. We thought we would give an update on some more recent activity at your Village Hall.

Our first Arts Alive event held in November was a huge success another sell out, the Canadian band was fantastic. We can look forward to more high quality Arts Alive events this year, we will keep you posted.

Ahead of the event we managed to install new acoustic panels, constructed from sheep's wool, this was in our plan and has noticeably improved the sound within the hall. Thanks again to The Forman Family whose generous donation enabled this to happen.

I am sure everyone is aware of the launch of The Happy Abbot Community Pub. We now have our own license for the sale of alcohol alongside our pub and events nights. A massive thanks to Anthony who has built us the most fantastic bar using all recycled materials. All this change means that any profits for running the bar are now returning to the Hall further strengthening our long term financial sustainability. Our next pub night is 31st January, please do come along, it's a great opportunity to meet other people in the village.

A consequence of the license is that we do need to install CCTV, a cost we had not foreseen, which will need to be installed by end of February. Externally we will be replacing the rotting wooden doors to the store during February.

Many of you will have noticed that we removed the overgrown leylandii hedge to the rear of the hall improving the light and vista. This created some disquiet from a number of quarters, however as part of our plan we are replanting with a deciduous hedge and your Parish Council have kindly donated the hedging plants, hopefully we will get those in shortly.

On a final note we will be saying goodbye to Andrea Coggins our treasurer due to family commitments. A big thank you to Andrea, it does however mean we are looking for a Treasurer going forwards. If you would like to be considered for this exciting post please contact myself or Hayley directly.
